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1. The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all children and young people who are in the care of St. Patrick's College are protected from harm and abuse.

2. This policy applies to all staff, students, and visitors to the college.

3. The college is committed to a culture of respect, dignity, and safety for all.

4. All staff and students should be aware of their responsibilities under this policy and should report any concerns immediately to the designated person.

5. The college will take appropriate action in response to any concerns or allegations of abuse.

6. This policy is reviewed annually and updated as necessary.

7. The college will cooperate with the relevant authorities in any investigation into a concern or allegation of abuse.

8. The college will ensure that all staff and students receive appropriate training and support.

9. The college will ensure that this policy is communicated to all staff and students.

10. The college will ensure that this policy is accessible to all staff and students.

11. The college will ensure that this policy is consistent with other policies and procedures.

12. The college will ensure that this policy is compliant with relevant legislation and regulations.

13. The college will ensure that this policy is compliant with the standards of the relevant regulatory bodies.

14. The college will ensure that this policy is compliant with the standards of the relevant professional bodies.

15. The college will ensure that this policy is compliant with the standards of the relevant industry bodies.

16. The college will ensure that this policy is compliant with the standards of the relevant community bodies.

17. The college will ensure that this policy is compliant with the standards of the relevant national bodies.

18. The college will ensure that this policy is compliant with the standards of the relevant international bodies.

19. The college will ensure that this policy is compliant with the standards of the relevant global bodies.

20. The college will ensure that this policy is compliant with the standards of the relevant universal bodies.

The school is committed to the protection and welfare of all children in its care. It is a member of the National Child Protection Board (NCPB) and is subject to its standards. The school has a Child Protection Policy which is reviewed annually. The policy is based on the principles of the Children's Act 2005 and the Child Protection Regulations 2005. The school has a designated child protection officer (DCPO) who is responsible for the implementation of the policy. The DCPO is supported by a child protection committee (CPC) which meets regularly to discuss and monitor the school's child protection arrangements. The school also has a child protection register (CPR) which is maintained and updated regularly. The school has procedures in place to identify, report and respond to child protection concerns. The school also provides training and support for staff and parents on child protection issues.

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
